On behalf of the Board of Directors and Staff of The Georgetown Project, we want you to know that you are a difference-maker for our organization, and for the youth and families we serve. We served 5,925 children and youth (and their parents and caregivers) with care and compassion this last year—93% were low-income. Staff provided almost 25,000 individual services. You made this possible.

The Georgetown Project has worked collaboratively to address the most pressing youth issues in our community for almost 25 years. As you know, Covid-19 disrupted daily life in many ways, bringing significant challenges for youth, families, and nonprofits alike. We see the aftereffects on kids every day in our programs. Honestly, we feel that 2021 has been a recovery year for local youth. They are dealing with everything from getting academics back on track, to unstable living conditions, to processing the death of a loved one. In each and every program space and interaction this year, we have prioritized Relationships, Resilience and Reconnecting to community. We were able to stay nimble, adapting programs and partnerships without compromising quality. It is always inspiring to me to see how the life of a child can be transformed with a safe environment and consistent relationships with caring adults. You made this possible.

I have included program information for your review. With your help, we were there for parents learning to raise healthy, school-ready children; for K-12 students and parents needing safe, affordable, enriching afterschool programs; and for our partners who tirelessly work alongside us in building a community where young people have the opportunity to thrive. I also shared a poem written by a teen served through our NEST Empowerment Center on the backside of this letter. She wanted our supporters to know that The Georgetown Project helped her through some tough times along her journey into young adulthood. I hope you enjoy reading it. You made this possible.

Your gifts to The Georgetown Project are meaningful, and we strive to be good stewards of your generosity. Looking ahead to 2022, our 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year, we hope to renovate program spaces for homeless and atrisk teens, and to continue empowering parents from all walks of life as they raise our youngest generation. We will continue our long history of engaging the youth voice in our community and working in tandem with other nonprofits to fill gaps. I hope you will remember The Georgetown Project this holiday season. We need your partnership now more than ever to ensure that children and youth remain high priority in Georgetown for the next 25 years. With your support, this will be possible.

I took responsibility of myself and my home took time to clean and mend me and my environment learned what it meant to help myself and learned what I really and truly needed versus what I desired and what others expected of me


Whatever goals I completed




