The Georgetown Project is partnering with local businesses to offer Georgetown and surrounding area high school students the opportunity to participate in the Summer Youth Employment Program. SYEP is a paid summer internship that offers valuable work experiences in entry-level employment positions.

#### **To qualify, applicant must be:**

- Currently enrolled in a High School in Georgetown during 2022-2023 School Year
- Must be at least 16 years old
- Willing to work an average of 20 hours per week
- Willing to work up to 8 weeks
- Available June and July
- Able to obtain transportation to and from work site
- Have parent signature on Application (if under 18)

SYEP not only connects students with employment, but also provides guidance through the entire employment process. Students will learn how to obtain and keep a job, conduct themselves in a professional manner, value time commitments on the job and constructively use work site evaluation feedback to develop their workplace skills.

SYEP may be the first opportunity the students have had to learn these skills that are crucial to future employment success.

#### **2023 SYEP Process:**

- Complete application (Due by April 28, 2023)
- Notification of selection by Friday, May 5
- SYEP Parent Meeting evening Thurs, May 18
- Interview with local business partner - TBA
- Attend Required Job Readiness Training June 1
- Arrange internship schedule
- Report for internship
- Work Site Supervisor will complete evaluations twice during internship
- SYEP Intern and TGP staff will discuss internship every two weeks
- Attend SYEP Celebration August 3 , 6-8 pm
