OUTCOMES THAT MATTER

Bridges to Growth

- Parents, childcare providers and others feel more confident in early child development and in creating enriching early environments for young children in their care.
- Preschool and Elementary school children attending early learning events build social-emotional skills need for school readiness.
- Spanish families feel connected to the community through ESL, Bilingual and Spanish parenting classes.
- An average 97% of families attending classes report an increase in knowledge since the program started 22 years ago.

After School Action Program

- GISD middle school students participate in homework assistance and experiential learning activities that connect academics to real life.
- Students gain leadership experience and learn the value of service.
- Available on all GISD middle school campuses, offering working families a safe, affordable afterschool program focused on academic success, career exploration and supporting student Sparks (interests, hobbies, passions).
- An average 85% of students show improvement in core subjects every year since the program started 24 years ago.

NEST Empowerment Center

- GISD homeless and at at-risk high school students access basic needs and supportive services among caring adults.
- Students build social-emotional, employment and other skills that lay the foundation for life after high school.
- Trauma-informed spaces and professional staff create an environment rich in Developmental Relationships and Developmental Assets.
- 100% graduation rate since the program started 10 years ago.

The Georgetown Project Collaborative for Children & Youth

- Longest running youth coalition in the community with a shared vision that Georgetown is a community where youth are high priority.
- Youth Summits, Town Halls and Service Days have engaged the youth voice for 25 years.
- Builds relationships, increases connectivity and ignites collaboration among local nonprofits serving children, youth and families.
- Focuses on data-driven approaches to identifying issues affecting children and youth, and gives rise to partnerships that harnesses collective energy to fill gaps in the safety net for young people.
- Serves as a model for coalitions across the United States looking to bring communities together around the Developmental Assets and Developmental Relationships framework of positive youth development.
