The NEST Empowerment Center seeks donations for food pantry, hygiene closet

As the start of the school year inches closer, the Georgetown Project's NEST Empowerment Center is seeking in-kind donations for its food pantry and hygiene closet. Donations are given to Georgetown ISD students, many of which are at-risk or experiencing homelessness.

Products needed include:

- Toothbrushes and toothpaste
- Shampoo, conditioner and body wash
- Deodorant
- Reusable water bottles
- Body cleansing wipes
- Shaving creams for both men and women
- Bath towels
- Feminine hygiene products such as pads, tampons and Diva cups
- Backpacks
- Paper towels
- Large and small trash bags
- Instant mac & cheese, Ramen noodles, Cup O Noodles and Chef Boyardee products
- Fruit cups, granola bars, Capri Suns and juice boxes
- Clorox wipes
- HEB gift cards

Services and resources provided include evening meals, school supplies, homework help, job readiness training, connection to community resources and caring adults, as well as other supportive, therapeutic and enriching services.

Community service opportunities are also provided weekly during the calendar school year to GISD high school students.
