OUTCOMES THAT MATTER

Bridges to Growth

- Enhances knowledge of parents, childcare providers, and others in child development and in creating enriching early environments that foster healthy brain development and nurturing early relationships.
- Builds social-emotional and early literacy skills in preschool children, promoting school readiness.
- Strengthens connections within the Spanish-speaking community through ESL, Bilingual, Citizenship, and Spanish parenting classes.
- Reports show knowledge increase of 97% among families attending classes since the program's inception 23 years ago.

After School Action Program

- Provides GISD middle school students with homework assistance and experiential learning.
- Cultivates leadership skills and instills the value of service.
- Offers safe, affordable afterschool programs on all GISD middle school campuses.
- 85% of participating students show improvement in core subjects since the program began 25 years ago.

NEST Empowerment Center

- Supports GISD homeless and at-risk high school students with basic needs and supportive services.
- Cultivates social-emotional, employment, and life skills, preparing the students for post-graduation success.
- Maintains trauma-informed spaces and professional staff for a nurturing environment.
- Maintains a 100% graduation rate over the program's 12-year history.
- Offers temporary emergency shelter for GISD students and families.

The Georgetown Project Collaborative for Children & Youth

- Represents the longest-running youth coalition, prioritizing
 Georgetown as a youth-centric community for the past 26 years.
- Engages youth through summits, town halls, and service days.
- Builds relationships, enhances connectivity, and fosters collaboration among local nonprofits serving children, youth, and families.
- Utilizes data-driven approaches to identify issues, forming partnerships to fill gaps in the safety net.
- Serves as a national model for coalitions focused on positive youth development using the Developmental Assets and Developmental Relationships frameworks created by Search Institute.
